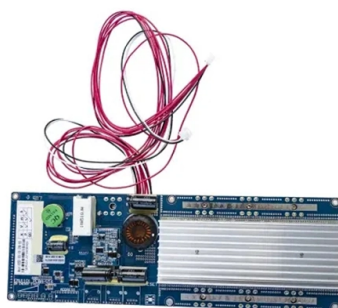

1. Location and Mounting

- Outgoing Wiring: Route outgoing circuits to the right side of the box, keeping main circuit connections on the left ().

- Ensure proper grounding of the distribution box and all circuits ().
- Clearly mark AC/DC circuits and voltage levels inside the box ().
- Perform visual inspections and multimeter tests before powering on to check for short circuits, overloads, or incorrect connections ().

6. Compliance and Documentation

- Follow local electrical codes (NEC, IEC, or regional standards) and use certified components ().
- Label all circuits and breakers for easy identification and future maintenance ().
- Record installation details for inspections and maintenance planning ().
